


DESIGN FOR A RAZOR-HANDLE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 21,634, dated June 21, 1892.

Application filed April 25, 1892. Serial No. 430,639. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Beitknown that I, JOSEPH R. TORREY, a citizen of the United States, residing at Worcester, in the county of Worcester and State of 5 Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Razor-Handles, of which the following is a specification, reference being had therein to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

The leading feature of my design consists in a handle having its outer surfaces ornamented with the representation of an ear of maize or Indian corn, which is represented as being curved to give the handle the desired 15 shape, and both sides of the handle are simi-

larly ornamented.

In the drawings, Figure 1 represents my newly-designed handle in side or face view, and Fig. 2 is a longitudinal edge view of the 20 same.

 $oldsymbol{\Lambda}$ denotes the two parts or sides of the han-

dle, provided on their outer surfaces with an ornamentation a in imitation of an ear of maize or Indian corn applied to the flattened outer surfaces of the handle, the representa- 25 tion of the rows of corn being, as herein shown, partly obscured by a representation of husks $ar{b}$, having a wavy and partly-curled appearance.

My newly-designed handle is intended more 30 particularly as a razor-handle, and to this end is shown as being curved to give it a graceful appearance and convenient shape.

I claim-

The design for a razor-handle, substantially 35 as herein shown and described.
